

"The Power of Regret, How Looking Backward Moves Us Forward" by Daniel H. Pink, debunks the myth of having no regrets. Do you know who Edith Piaf is? She's in there along with stories about people who got "No Regrets" tattoos. People are adamant about not regretting anything. Me? I have a lot of regret but thanks to this book, I now have a better perspective on regret and how it can help me.

The first part of the book is "Regret Reclaimed". Daniel Pink used research in social psychology, neuroscience, and biology and the largest sampling of American attitudes about regret. He also created his own survey. Go ahead and take it at www.worldregretsurvey.com. It's simple. Type in your regret in the first box. Then answer questions about your age, gender, state, and enter your email if you are willing to be interviewed. I'm not sure if he is still following up on this because the interviews were to be collected for the book but at the end of the survey, you can read regrets from people around the world. I spent a brief amount of time on this site and thought it was interesting.

Back to the book: in the first few chapters, he inserts a handful of graphs and pictures, including graphs of the most common regrets in 2005, 2011, and 2021. Survey methods have vastly improved through the years so the 2005 results may be are definitely questionable.

When considering regret, remember that it is about something that was in our control to do differently. Processing regret can help us make better decisions moving forward.

In Part Two, we learn the four core regrets.

- 1) Foundation Regrets. These regrets can be identified with the words "too much" or "too little" such as: I skipped too many classes, or I studied too little when I was in college. These are difficult to undo.
- 2) Boldness Regrets choosing to play it safe.
- 3) Moral Regrets makes up the smallest percentage of regrets but can last the longest. It's choosing the wrong path.
- 4) Connection Regrets makes up the largest percentage of regrets. These are about any relationship we had, or didn't have, with others.

In Part Three, "Regret Remade", we get into how to apply strategies for using our regrets to learn and grow. There are many options here. You may remember both of these helpful tools from "Chatter" by Ethan Kross that I reviewed in August 2021: normalizing negative experiences, as in, everyone has them; and self-distancing, but this time it is with time travel.

The book ends with a chapter on "Anticipating Regret" and one last survey with a group of university students. When thinking about how something may work out in the future if you do A, could help you decide to do B instead.
