**LOCATION:** Our Annual Meeting will be held at Plymouth Church, UCC,1217 Sixth Avenue, Seattle, WA 98101. There is some parking at the church with overflow parking at the IBM parking lot. 
All clergy with standing in the Pacific Northwest Conference are considered to be delegates. They are not counted in the delegate designation from the local church. The method for determining delegates is:

- Three lay delegates per congregation, PLUS
- One additional lay delegate for each 100 members (or fraction thereof) above 200, PLUS
- One additional lay delegate to be under the age of 26.

The last available annual yearbook statistics will be used as the basis for computing the number of delegates.

**Delegate voting cards will be available at the registration table with your nametag.** Your church's Fellowship Dues must be paid to the Conference before Annual Meeting in order for your

# Transitions

#### Larry Stuart Baker - March 27, 1938 - February 1, 2024

Larry was born in Olympia, Washington and spent his youth there, graduating from Olympia High School in 1956, then on to the University of Puget Sound, graduating in 1960. He then attended Andover Newton Theological School in Boston for 3 years. He began his internship year in ministry at Monroe Congregational church in WA in 1963. He was ordained to the Christian Ministry at Fauntleroy Church (UCC) in September 1964. He returned to Monroe in the early 70's and remained their pastor for over 30 years, commuting from his home in Gig Harbor, with his wife of 40 years, Lauren Joy. He also had a long career working with Comprehensive Mental Health of Pierce County and the non-profit Directions, ETC. His goal for his clients, their families, and clinicians was to guide them to a path to achieve mental wellness.

#### Sonia Baker - December 13, 1934 - January 15, 2024

Sonia Edwards Baker, 89, died at her home at Skyline, on First Hill in Seattle on January 15, 2024. She grew up in Renton and earned a degree in English from the University of Oregon. She married Maurice Bell for 20 years before divorcing. Sonia and Kendall Baker were married in 1976 and had a blended family of 8 children. The family moved to Tucson where Kendall was pastor of First Congregational UCC. Sonia earned a Masters degree in Urban Planning from the University of Arizona and was involved in neighborhood planning. They served churches in Wisconsin, Kansas, and California before moving to Seattle where they spent their retirement years. Sonia is survived by her husband Kendall, 4 children, 4 step children and 13 grandchildren and 7 great-grandchildren.

The boy with the nose knows! There are two great camp options for younger children this summer, and they are being held at both N-Sid-Sen and Pilgrim Firs!




