

The Afro-Christian Convention encompassed 25,000 members from Texas to Virginia, 150 churches, a publishing house, schools, local and global missions, and an indominable spirit of resilience and faith.

The Rev Dr Yvonne Delk, or Mother Delk, is a national award-winning preacher, educator, and social justice advocate with 60 years of experience across 5 continents. She serves on the Board of Trustees for the Franklinton Center at the Bricks, established by the Afro-Christian Convention 150 years ago, and an ongoing UCC legacy institution, for retreats, research, and social justice.

Coalition of congregations and partners to host a four-night revival



This fall a coalition of congregations and partners are hosting a 4-night revival. Our theme is "Reclaiming the Welfare of the City: A Revival for Racial Reconciliation," based on the scripture Jeremiah 29. Our revival will include vibrant music, powerful preaching, creative expression, and multi-racial community building.

Our revival begins on **October 3rd** at Mount Zion Baptist Church in Seattle's Central District. Rev. Yolanda Norton, founder of Global Arts and Theology Experience (GATE) and the curator of the Beyoncé Mass, is our opening night preacher. GATE's *Black Girl Magic Ensemble* will lead music. This is the same worship team that brought the Beyoncé Mass to Seattle in the spring of 2021.

On **October 4th**, we will gather at Quest Church in Ballard. In partnership with Acts On Stage theater, we present a unique arts-based, interactive worship & workshop experience. This night of the revival invites attendees to witness and then discuss a theatrical presentation entitled, *Story of An Off Brand Band*. Written by Michelle Lang-Raymond, this one-act play is an art imitating life piece that centers us on the Micah 6:8 call to "do justice,

love mercy, and walk humbly with God". Suitable for all ages. Discussion groups will be based on age with mild facilitation.

On **October 5th**, we converge downtown at Plymouth United Church of Christ. Preaching this night is Rev. Steve Jerbi, Minister of Christian Formation, Love & Justice at University Congregation UCC in Seattle. The Chancel Choir from UCUCC will offer music and the *Black Girl Magic Ensemble* returns as our praise band.

Our closing night, **October 6th**, moves to the U-district at University Congregational United Church of Christ.Rev. Joe Kim, lead pastor at Bothell United Methodist Church, is our preacher this night. Musical selections will come from the *Black Girl Magic Ensemble* and the praise team at Kingdom Family Worship Center.



Dear King County Advocates,

We want to share with you some urgent needs in your area and ask if you can help.

Help needed for immigrants camping at Riverton Park United Methodist Church in Tukwila!

You may have seen today's article in the Seattle Times, focused on FAN partner Riverton Park United Methodist Church in Tukwila, which has been hosting and helping more than 180 people--mostly immigrants and asylum seekers--camping at the church. Pastor Jan Bolerjack has told us of several urgent needs:

- Volunteers to help respond to requests from those who are camping. A donation coordinator, case managers, immigration helpers and chaos preventers.
- Supplies like tents, blankets, tarps and warm clothes

We also want to share opportunities for King County individuals and faith communities who want to act on homelessness this fall:

 The Seattle/King County Coalition on Homelessness is offering trainings for IN-PERSON VOTING RIGHTS to help register eligible voters who are homeless, newly or unstably housed, or have past felony convictions. These trainings prepare participants to do informative, non-partisan, and trauma-informed voter education with those who face barriers. Pre-registration is required for these trainings.

• FAN has endorsed the renewal of the Seattle Housing Levy that will appear on your November 7 ballot. This proposed Levy would raise \$970 million over the next seven years. Our taxes will go to produce and preserve 3,500 affordable homes,

provide rental assistance to 4,500 households at risk of eviction, fund operations for permanent supportive housing for 1,150 formerly homeless people, and more. You can learn more about it <u>here (https://yesforhomes.org/</u>). To help pass the levy, you can:

- Endorse the Levy as a faith community (Although faith communities can't endorse candidates, we can legally support initiatives and bills.)
- Participate in voter outreach (phone and text banks) through the Coalition on Homelessness. Email Hali to get involved.
- Residents of Burien are encouraged to write a letter to the editor in response to <u>Ordinance 818</u> passed this week by a 4-3 majority of the Burien City Council. The ordinance bans people who sleep or have tents or other materials related to "camping" in public places from 10.00 p.m. to 6.00 a.m.
- Finally, this fall is full of opportunities to SPEAK UP and make sure Seattle and King County electeds prioritize housing, essential services, and the workers who provide them, and sustain and expand investments in evidence-based practices and policy solutions to homelessness.
