## Building Capacity, Learning by Doing: Active Antiracism Efforts YOU Funded! Room 400 - Session 2

Alki UCC, Guemes Island Community Church, and Sunnyslope Church of the Brethren will participate in a panel discussion on their learnings, missteps, and renewed commitments to dismantling white supremacy mythology in their local settings. Each received a grant from the Church Development Committee to support innovative programming for community engagement in antiracist action.
